Two HVAC Units Need Replacing

"Well, that's not good!" That was my response as our HVAC technician came down off of our roof during our late-March cold snap with the bad news. Not only was the HVAC for our church office and restrooms dead and unable to be repaired, we learned that the HVAC unit for our Fellowship Hall, Kitchen and Youth Room is on its last legs as well. These units are over 30 years old, and were put into service back when the church was rebuilt from the fire in the early 1990's.

After getting second opinions and multiple bids for replacement, the Session has decided to move forward on a bid. The amount is just under \$40,000 to replace both units, including the hiring of a crane to remove the old units and place the new units. The Session has already done its due diligence in applying and receiving temporary financing through the Synod of the Pacific. The Session also applied for a Barnabas Grant through the Presbytery, but was unsuccessful due to a lack of available funds and too many requests to Presbytery.



Just like owning a home, owning a church building means that occasionally stuff breaks down and needs replacing, and somehow, we need to pay for it. While we have some building funds in reserves, there is not enough to cover this expense and leave us funds for future emergencies. So, we are asking our HPC family for your help. Would you prayerfully consider a one-time generous gift to help us with the replacement cost of these two HVAC units? The more we raise, the less we have to borrow and pay over time.


June 23rd is HPC's Evening at the Hops - tickets are sold out and we're looking forward to a fun evening of baseball at the Hillsboro stadium.




Clerk's Corner
