Cindy Cunningham, the Founder and Director of Village of Hope Uganda, has ministered to children, teens, and adults for over 35 years. She previously served at Josh McDowell Ministries, African Leadership and Reconciliation Ministries (ALARM), and Youth for Christ. She has traveled to and served countries around the world, including Japan, Russia, Romania, Belarus, Congo, Sudan, Rwanda, Kenya and Uganda.

In 2006 her ministry position took her to Central & Eastern Africa, where Missions she first visited Northern Uganda. It was hearing the stories of young children who were abducted and forced to become child soldiers and sex slaves, along with witnessing tens of thousands of lives devastated by war, that Cindy asked the question, "Lord, what do you want me to do"?

With a fervent passion and calling, Cindy founded Village of Hope to help abandoned orphans, vulnerable women and children traumatized by war find HOPE...hope experienced through having a home, an education, skills training, pastoral and medical care, discipleship, trauma counseling, micro-economic opportunities and most importantly, the transforming power of Jesus Christ.

Cindy speaks on behalf of Village of Hope to churches, organizations and donors across the U.S. She visits Uganda 3-4 times a year to encourage the staff and leadership, plan strategic projects, manage programs and host mission teams. Cindy has served as Founder and Executive Director at VOH since its inception in 2007.



HPC Celebrates: A SUCCESSFUL FALL CRAFT FAIR! 2012 - 2023!!

Every year since 2012 (that's 12 years) HPC has hosted a Fall Craft Fair, opening our doors to all types of home artisans and inviting the Public to enjoy! And ENJOY they have! Isn't that just like God?! HE offers a creative talent, something we enjoy spending time on, and HE offers a venue to share with others. Not all vendors attend HPC, in fact, some of them may not even attend a church. But WE start the Sales Day in Prayer! We share our time, our talents, and (sometimes) our Faith. "They will know we are Christians by our Love"

Each year, even during our Closed-COVID year, we were able to send Vendor Space Rental fees & Offerings to support Village of Hope-Uganda (VOH)! During the worst of the Pandemic (2020), when all public gatherings were shut down, we had loyal crafters who wanted to make a difference! They sent their Vendor Space Rental Fees and when we had to cancel, the majority asked that their money be sent to VOH-Uganda. Most were not HPC attendees; just folks who wanted to make a difference. HPC gave them that opportunity.

The Craft Fair has changed over the years: Remember when Donna Hogan and Aunt Martha used to 'take over the kitchen' and provide snacks and lunch (multiple offerings) to hungry attendees [both vendors and their customers]?! We even enjoyed "Blue BBQ", a food truck vendor, one year after Donna/Don Hogan moved to the East Coast. Then HPC Bakers rolled up their sleeves and, WOW"!!! And when Bake Sale Organizers, Jill Cessna (2021/2022) and Nancy Johnson (2023) changed the Buying Rule to "Make a Donation!"?!

GOD MADE A WAY!! GREAT JOB!! WELL DONE, HPC Bakers!! Over the years, HPC sent over ~\$7,470 to Village of Hope-Uganda! 2023 Craft Fair Vendor Fees of \$962 was included in this total. In 2023, Bake Sale proceeds totaled \$938 for HPC Building Maintenance.

In 2023, HPC hosted 18 vendors (7 from HPC)! We hope you enjoyed Ben Appel's Wooden Snowflakes; Sandy McFerran's Epoxy tumblers/Mugs/Charcuterie Boards; Laura & Thad MacMillan's Spin-painting pictures/3D printed gifts; Tammy McVean/Jamie Floch's Wreaths/Halloween/Christmas Ornaments/Jewel-sparkle Bags; April & Dale Schroder's Bird Houses/Painted Rocks/Signs; Sue Dever's Bathrobes/Aprons/Sharks-Mermaid Indoor Sleeping Bags/Blankets; and Rick & Jacquie Harrison's [treasure trove] of crafts from VOH and Israel!

We hope the option of donating online helps many of us who don't carry checks or cash every day, but still want to financially support HPC.




1. We don't "pass the plate" any longer, but we have a box inside the doors as you enter the sanctuary and you may place your donation there on Sunday.
