Advent: The Season of Reflection, Anticipation & Worship
Happy New Year! Did you know that Advent is the start of the Christian
calendar each year? The Season of Advent, which is represented by the
four Sundays before Christmas Eve, was established by the church more
than 1600 years ago as a time of preparation and expectation. The Latin
word ADVENTUS actually has a dual meaning, as it referred to BOTH the
advent of Christ's birth, as well as the advent of Christ's second coming.

REFLECTION

For the Jewish people living before Jesus' birth, they lived in a time of constant expectation. God had promised a Messiah who would come and set them free...a high expectation that only God could fulfill. That time of expectation was centuries long for the Jewish people (and is reflected throughout the Old Testament Scriptures.) For us, the four Sundays of Advent are meant for us to reflect on those years of waiting, as well as to reflect that the promises of God are always fulfilled in Lastly, we reflect on the blessing that we have that we live with a fe

as well as to reflect that the promises of God are always fulfilled in God's perfect timing. Lastly, we reflect on the blessing that we have that we live with a faith that is blessed by the work of the Messiah and our restoration of relationship with our Creator.

ANTICIPATION

In the classic hymn "Joy to the World" Issac Watts pens these telling words: "Joy to the World, the Lord IS come. Let earth receive her King. Let every heart prepare Him room, and heaven and nature sing..." Watts wrote this verse intentionally with the dual theology of Advent...using both present and future tense to convey a sense of anticipation. The Lord IS come...and there will be a time coming in the future when earth will receive her King to rule over all things. Until then, we are called to prepare room in our hearts for when Jesus returns to earth to rule. This is the call of anticipation that Advent gives us. Reflect on God's previous work and anticipate the promises of God yet to come.

WORSHIP

After we have embraced the duality of Advent, then our hearts can return to the present moment, and worship fully. We hear the individual stories of Zechariah and Elizabeth, of Mary and then Joseph, who each receive the word from God of the miracles to come, humbly accept their place in God's work, and then each worship God fully through prayer, song, or faithful living. They can do so knowing that God is at work and God is fully in control. Advent lastly calls us to find our trust that God is still fully in control, is still very much at work, and then offer our hearts as our gift of worship.

REFLECT...ANTICIPATE...WORSHIP. I pray over these four weeks of Advent that we can write these callings on our hearts as we fully embrace "Emanuel: God with us," the One who was, who is, and who is to come.

Born in Grand Rapids, Michigan in April of 1944, he received a Christian elementary education then attended a public high school. He graduated from Grand Rapids Junior college in 1965 and was drafted into the Amry in early 1966. He served 2 years, one year of which was spent in Vietnam.



Discharged in 1968, he married Peggy, and they headed back to school. He attended Hope College and Western Theological Seminary in Holland, Michigan, graduating in 1974. He served 4 RCA churches in Illinois, Florida, and Iowa. During that time, he and Peggy were blessed with 3 children, Michelle, BethAnn and Joshua.

Life can be challenging. Changing locations, changing jobs, changing professions. In the late 80's he tried sales, occasionally providing pulpit supply in RCA, Christian Reformed, Nazarene, and Presbyterian Churches. The family experiences its own set of challenges including the loss of their eldest daughter to cancer.

He thinks of himself as an outdoors man but spends much more of his time indoors these days. He tries to walk regularly but that time between walks is not very regular. A good book, preferably Christain, action, fiction, can entertain him for hours. However, there is nothing like a lively Biblical discussion to get the blood flowing and it is exciting to see someone's eyes light up when they discover a fresh view of a remembered truth from God's Word, a promise remembered or revealed, or an act of God's grace realized.




Events & Fellowship

HPC Online Giving Available

Online giving is available and ready to use for your convenience!

There are several ways you can donate online:

- 1. Download the free "Vanco Mobile" app on your iPhone or Android
- 2. Scan the QR code to the right.
- 3. Go to our website; www.hillsboropres.org and click on the "donate now" button.





You can set up a profile so it is easier each time you log in to give, or you can donate as a guest user each time. Donations can be from a checking/savings account, or a bank card.

We hope the option of donating online helps many of us who don't carry checks or cash every day, but still want to financially support HPC.

- 1. We don't "pass the plate" any longer, but we have a box inside the doors as you enter the sanctuary and you may place your donation there on Sunday.
- 2. You may set up a regular "bill-pay" through your bank that will automatically send a check to the church.
- 3. You can use our online giving "Vanco" and set up a regular payment with your credit card or with your bank account.
- 4. You may set up an automatic RMD (Required Minimum Distribution) or other automatic payment from your retirement account.
