PASTOR MESSAGE

Rev. Rachel Guevara

God is absolutely always doing a new thing.

"Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: The old has gone, the new is here!" – 2 Corinthians 5:17

There has been a lot of "new" at HPC in the last several months. It hasn't slowed down for a moment! You'll see evidence of much of that newness in this newsletter. From building repairs and paint, to new ministries, to reboots of previous ministries, to much participation in worship ... we even had three opportunities to celebrate friends' and members' lives. "Busy" doesn't even describe it!

The season of Advent, as well as days leading up to Advent, are a race to Christmas Day, at least as consumers. As a culture, we have skipped right over Thanksgiving for many years. My concern is we "skip" Christmas too, or simply the worship, expression, and experience of Christmas Day, God's gift to us in Jesus Christ.

You'll want to join us at 9:50 AM on Sundays during Advent for a Christmas Carol Sing! You'll want to join us Christmas Eve at 5:00 pm. Children and babies are welcome; it will be a family-friendly service. We will have a "children's time," and special activity bags will allow our nursery attendants to worship with us.

Has this fall been a difficult time for you? It has for many. Whether it is the political state of affairs, the loss of someone special, ongoing violence around our world, or things that have come up in our own families, it has been a difficult time for many. Know that as we celebrate God's gift at Christmas to us, God's promise is always to do something new and for the birth of that baby to change the world and to bring us hope.





1. Replace Chancel Spotlight system:

a. Replacement was completed September 25, by Mike's Electric.

2. Inside Painting -

a. HPC members (**Thank You Gary & Dana Gale**) have completed painting the Green classroom and the Office. Yellow and Blue Class rooms remain to be painted.

3. Manse Roof Replacement

a. Being that the Manse roof is at least 30 years old, and we noticed some areas of concern, we had it inspected. The property commission decided that it is time to have the Manse roof replaced. The replacement will be done by Ability Plus Roofing in early December, weather permitting.

4. Information is being collected to figure out how to repair the leaks in the Sanctuary.

a. **NOTE:** the roofing over the sanctuary is not related to the roof repairs completed during the summer.

HPC ONLINE GIVING

Online giving is available and ready to use for your convenience!

There are several ways you can donate online:

- 1. Download the free "Vanco Mobile" app on your iPhone or Android
- 2. Scan the QR code to the right.
- 3. Go to our website; www.hillsboropres.org and click on the "donate now" button.



You can set up a profile so it is easier each time you log in to give, or you can donate as a guest user each time. Donations can be from a checking/savings account, or a bank card.

We hope the option of donating online helps many of us who don't carry checks or cash every day, but still want to financially support HPC.

1. We don't "pass the plate" any longer, but we have a box inside the doors as you enter the sanctuary and you may place your donation there on Sunday.

2. You may set up a regular "bill-pay" through your bank that will automatically send a check to the church.

3. You can use our online giving "Vanco" and set up a regular payment with your credit card or with your bank account.

4. You may set up an automatic RMD (Required Minimum Distribution) or other automatic payment from your retirement account.
