PASTOR MESSAGE

Rev. Kelly Dickson

Dear HPC Family,

I love the season of fall in Oregon. As a native Californian, I became so accustomed to two seasons...warm season and hot season. This morning, I walked my neighborhood with a friend and gave thanks for the arrival of the crisp fall air and the changing colors in the leaves above my head. The seasonal changes also prepare me for the rhythms that shift in the life of the church as we move into stewardship season and

then shift again into Advent.

As we head into October, we will be concluding our sermon series on the book of James which we have labeled, Faith that Works. James has invited us to examine our discipleship honestly and has challenged us to consider the ways we talk, think and act through the lens of Christ's heart for the world. We have been encouraged to seek the alignment of our words and actions. Together, we have wondered, "what does it look like to live out our faith in a way that considers the needs of others...even when we don't agree or align? Is our discipleship more "me"-oriented or others-oriented? Do we love and serve others as a means to an end, or in response to the Divine

persuasion of a loving God?"



In October and November, we will be asking the question, "What is the church FOR?" and we will seek answers to this question in Acts. More often than not, any mention of the church these days brings to mind a building...but we know a building is not required for the people of God to gather and be the church. So then, what is the church for...or what is the purpose and mission of the gathered people of God...us? Let's explore the answer to that question together. The book of Acts will be our guide through Stewardship season, and we have selected the following passage as our theme for our stewardship campaign:

³² All the believers were one in heart and mind. No one claimed that any of their possessions was their own, but they shared everything they had. ³³With great power the apostles continued to testify to the resurrection of the Lord Jesus. And **God's grace was so powerfully at work** in them all ³⁴that there were no needy persons among them. For from time to time those who owned land or houses sold them, brought the money from the sales ³⁵ and put it at the apostles' feet, and it was distributed to anyone who had need." **Acts 4:32-35**

The word that I regularly use to describe the HPC church family is grace—which is why we chose this verse to be our theme for this year's stewardship campaign. The meaning of this word "grace" in the Greek is kindness, gift or blessing. The source of grace is always Christ Jesus, so we look like Jesus when we extend grace to others. I want to challenge our entire congregation to try to name three "graces" each day that you have experienced (whether in a journal or aloud) in the month of October. Name the small or large moments where you experienced God's kindness, gifts or blessings, and then ask God how God might be inviting you to be God's extension of grace to others around you as well. May our gratitude be as abundant this fall as the leaves falling to the earth!

Grateful for this church family.





DEACONS BEACON



Online giving is available and ready to use for your convenience!


- There are several ways you can donate online:1. Download the free "Vanco Mobile" app on your iPhone or Android

 - 3. Go to our website; www.hillsboropres.org and click on the "donate now" button.




You can set up a profile so it is easier each time you log in to give, or you can donate as a guest user each time. Donations can be from a checking/savings account, or a bank card.
