## **Pastors Peace**

...but we proclaim Christ crucified, a stumbling block to Jews and foolishness to Gentiles, but to those who are the called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God. For God's foolishness is wiser than human wisdom, And God's weakness is stronger than human strength. Corinthians 1:23-25



In the spring when my heart turns to softball and baseball, I miss those days when I coached my daughters and then granddaughters. And though I get more than my fill of baseball while scoring games for the Hillsboro Hops, it's not the same as shaping the skills of those young players. I even miss those days when I would drag the field before practice or a game. Hand-dragging the infield involved pulling a metal grate around the entire infield to smooth it out and remove any small rocks. As a spiritual practice I literally prayed for the girls who would use this field, asking God's blessing.

While going round and round the infield, small stones would pop up here and there. The Apostle Paul wrote about the cross of Christ being a "stumbling block." The thought of a crucified savior was, and still is, difficult for many to grasp. If you had been waiting for thousands of years for God to send a savior to rescue you from your enemies, you don't expect him to end up nailed to a cross.

Though Jesus' cross can be a stumbling block, his ministry and mission is to remove stumbling blocks from those seeking to come close to God. Like removing the stones on the softball field to give the players an opportunity to play the ball cleanly, Jesus took every opportunity to remove the obstacles that kept seekers from experiencing God. A stone on the infield can cause a ball to bounce away from the fielder, or worse, to take a bad hop into their face. A stumbling block along the road to faith can cause one to feel unwelcomed or unworthy when approaching God.

"If any of you put a stumbling block before one of these little ones who believe in me, it would be better for you if a great millstone were fastened around your neck and you were drowned in the depth of the sea. Woe to the world because of stumbling blocks! Occasions for stumbling are bound to come, but woe to the one by whom the stumbling block comes!" (Matt. 18:6-7)


Paul follows with:

#### Pastors Peace Continued...

Unlike a ballfield, Israel is a land of rocks and stones. Walking along dirt roads in the 1st century was a constant reminder of stumbling blocks. Jesus encountered stumbling blocks to faith throughout the religious system of that time. As he entered Jerusalem in the first Palm Sunday parade, the people's expectation of a conquering warrior was a stumbling block to understanding his mission. When Jesus turned over the tables of those making a buck from the religious requirements for sacrifice, he was removing a stumbling block to the temple. The temple itself had a low fence around it to keep out and warn any non-Jews that they were not to go past this barrier under penalty of death! How's that for a welcome to one seeking to know God? Though the cross became a stumbling block to some, in reality it removed the stumbling block of sin, giving us clear access to God.

As people take part in this community of faith at HPC, seeking the presence of God, are there stumbling blocks we need to clear from the path? Like dragging the infield, do we need to smooth the way for guests to be welcomed and included here? Do we put a stumbling block before children and families with a look over their childlike noises? Is it a stumbling block when newcomers are left to figure out "the way we do things?" Will someone in the LBGTQ+ community find our welcome to be genuine? Do we cause those we've known for years to stumble when we fail to let them know they've been missed?

Our Lord Jesus bursts forth from the tomb conquering death and clearing the way for all to know abundant life for eternity. May our Easter celebration find us joining our Lord to remove all the obstacles that would cause others to stumble, living in such a manner as to give to all a view and experience of what life in the Kingdom is like. Let us, like our Servant Lord, serve in such a way that all would know that Christ is risen! Joy and Peace,

## Monthly Missions

This April, Missions is focusing its efforts to help the people of Ukraine. During Lent the Presbytery has a special offering, One Great Hour of Sharing. This special offering supports the Presbyterian Disaster Assistance Program (PDA).

In 2021, Presbyterian Disaster Assistance supported:

- \$3.1 million granted in 30 states and 15 countries
- 60 National Response Team members were deployed to 19 presbyteries
- 112 Presbyterian Women trained in Disaster Preparedness
- 400 work team volunteers served in CA, NC, NE and NJ Developed a new grant opportunity supporting refugee and asylum advocacy programs
- Hosted more than 500 people in 41 Emotional & Spiritual programs In partnership with Church World Service, assisted in the collection and distribution of 191,182 Gift of the Heart Kits and blankets

The PDA also has an emergency fund that goes directly to Ukraine.

**Emergency response to Ukraine war** 



As the violence in Ukraine continues, the number of people being displaced internally and fleeing to neighboring countries increases by the day. And in the midst of the chaos, there are sibling churches and ecumenical partners who are already providing assistance with basic items for survival. Our first priority is to provide funding to these partners on the ground. While the scale of this crisis is new, receiving refugees from Ukraine and other countries in Central and Eastern Europe is not, which means we have trusted, established partners with the knowledge and expertise to carry out this important work. Our response will include both financial and technical assistance as the network of faith communities providing humanitarian assistance grows in the months ahead.

GIVE: To support emergency relief for those fleeing Ukraine, designate gifts to Ukraine on the HPC giving page of our website.

ACT: Urge the U.S. government to support generous aid for refugees and civilians suffering in Ukraine, and call for engaging a diplomatic solution to the conflict.

**PRAY:** May we undergird our prayers with tangible resources to help. May we reach deeply, give generously, and welcome extravagantly. May we lift our voices in a strong and unified advocacy.

May we all, even as we breathe in lament, breathe out mercy, hope and peace. And in this Lenten season, when we walk the way toward death and resurrection, repent our complicity in cultures of violence and renew our efforts toward justice and peace.

## Sacred Stewards

As you know, we have approved a deficit budget (meaning expenses are higher than the income that is expected) for the church. We've done this for a few years now and have been fortunate that what has been budgeted is not what we actually received, and our income has been about equal to expenses.

The last several years we have seen a decline in the amount of money we have received from member giving. In 2018, member giving was \$112,500. In 2021, member giving had dropped to \$84,500. Some of the decline is because some members have moved, some have passed away and some are attending other churches.

Because giving has declined, we have been dipping into our savings in order to pay the regular bills. At the moment, we still have a healthy balance in savings, but it won't last forever.

I mentioned in an earlier newsletter that people could contribute their portion of per capita of \$39.00 and many of you have done that. Thank you, that's been a big help. If you haven't contributed to that and want to, please mark your gift with "per capita" to distinguish it from your regular giving.

What can be done to help? The biggest thing any of us can do is pray and see where God is leading us. We passed the deficit budget knowing we are trusting God to make it work. And we all know from experience that God doesn't operate in a vacuum. He uses each of us to fulfill His purpose.

Thank you for praying and caring about HPC.

- Received thank you notes from donated missions: Firm Foundation in Christ Ministries (supporting new believers in Ethiopia and Nigeria) – this was a personal note




and thank you from Carly Powne, Oregon Food Bank, Hillsboro School District – for donated school supplies.
