We've had an announcement slide up the last few weeks that says per capita assessment per member is \$45.60. I wanted to give a little background.

Per capita is calculated each year on our church's prior year's membership. Since the per capita amount was figured out during 2023, the amount we are charged is for the number of members we had at the end of 2022.

I always thought of this as some generic kind of tax that Presbytery charges each congregation. But it isn't. The money that is collected is distributed as follows for 2024:

General Assembly \$9.80

Synod of the Pacific \$5.22

Presbytery of the Cascades \$30.58

Total \$45.60 per Capita/Member for 2024

What is SHAN CHURCH CHU

We had 82 members at the end of 2022. Multiply that by \$45.60 and our assessment is \$3,739.

- 3. Go to our website; www.hillsboropres.org and click on the "donate now" button.


You can set up a profile so it is easier each time you log in to give, or you can donate as a guest user each time. Donations can be from a checking/savings account, or a bank card.
