PASTOR MESSAGE

Rev. Rachel Guevara

Church Family,

As we began this Lenten season together, we focused first on our identity in Christ. Our women's ministry group once spoke of all of the "hats" we wear. Some days it just feels like so many! My identity is made up of a combination of parent, spouse, daughter, sister, aunt, friend, pastor, caregiver, chaplain, and much more like dog-mom, gardener, home renovator, and colleague! It is too much to list and too many roles to try to live into.

But as I considered the temptation of Jesus following his launch into public ministry (Matthew 3:13-4:11), I knew the most important of the hats we wear is the one that says "God's child." I am a Child of God. You are a Child of God. Jesus did not doubt his own identity for a moment; he leaned on God, his Father, who was the only validation he needed.

This is a tremendous time of division in our country. It feels as if we have been forced to the "right" or the "left," to take sides on most things instead of working with one another with a focus on what we have in common and what is important to our Lord: loving God and loving our neighbor (Matthew 22:37-39). While we focus on transformation in Christ during this Lenten season, the backdrop is the need for this brotherly and sisterly love, which sees the image of God in others. When all of the hats we have to wear and the roles we have to play feel like too much, we remember who we are in Christ and who others are in Christ.

How do we do this?

When there are occasions that upset us, we take a step back and spend a moment with the One who created us.

When there are people we do not understand, we ask questions, in loving and gentle tones, so that we may know them better, without judgment.

When we are concerned by what is out of our control, we cast our worry upon God and pray in gratitude.

I am convinced that as Children of God, our Maker has given us great responsibility - to remember who we are, as Jesus did, and to ensure others know how loved they are by God. I look forward to seeing you during this season as we worship together. Take a look around at HPC; is there someone new you could sit by or someone you could call who is missing, to communicate God's love to them?



Come a little early to enjoy special music by Grace Stramel before the service as we prepare our hearts for worship.








Read and Worship with Us!

God's Word is a gift to us, as the Holy Spirit speaks through our reading, touching our lives. This Lenten season, I invite you to develop this practice - even just a few minutes each day - to learn something new about the God who created us and about ourselves. There are simple ways to start, and one of those is to follow along with our sermon series. The next several weeks of texts are listed; read them each week to deepen your experience of worship on Sunday morning.

Sacred Encounters: Lives Transformed by Christ

The Season of Lent began on February 18th, with Ash Wednesday, and through this season we take a look at two of the Gospels to learn of lives transformed by Jesus Christ. Our texts this season are from the Revised Common Lectionary, and listed below, we invite you to read along with us. For a deeper look, the Sunday Bible Study group (who meets at 9:00 am), reads Sunday's scriptures and discusses my sermons. You are invited to attend.



A BIG THANK YOU to our congregation
and
all the helping hands that help when no one is looking!

HPC yard clean up day - Saturday 28-Mar-2026 starts at 9am.

Projects for this day are:

- Clean out the debris in the playground area around the play structure. This needs to be done before fresh bark chips can be added.
- Trim low branches on trees around the HPC property.
- Do a major trim on the large bushes located between the sanctuary and 32nd street.

1. Inside Painting -

The yellow room has been repainted. Painting of the Fellowship Hall is on hold, due to other project funding needs.

2. Sanctuary Roof leaks -

Property commission has decided to have the upper windows, where we think the leaks are originating, resealed. The window resealing will be done by Billings and Sons at a cost of \$4,500, and is expected to be completed by March 1st, weather permitting. We hope this stops the leaks. If the leaks are not fixed, we will investigate having the roofing repaired. Because the shingled roof areas are 30 years old we know they need to be replaced. Replacing the shingled roof requires funding and finding a contractor. Estimates for replacement range from \$60,000 to \$ \$160,000.

3. Fire Monitoring Communication Device failure -

The new Communication Device was installed on 21-Jan-2026.

4. Kitchen Dishwasher Replacement. -

Research is in progress.

There are several ways you can donate online:


1. Download the free "Vanco Mobile" app on your iPhone or Android
2. Scan the QR code to the right.
3. Go to our website; www.hillsboropres.org and click on the "donate now" button.




You can set up a profile so it is easier each time you log in to give, or you can donate as a guest user each time. Donations can be from a checking/savings account, or a bank card.

We hope the option of donating online helps many of us who don't carry checks or cash every day, but still want to financially support HPC.

1. We don't "pass the plate" any longer, but we have a box inside the doors as you enter the sanctuary and you may place your donation there on Sunday.
2. You may set up a regular "bill-pay" through your bank that will automatically send a check to the church.
3. You can use our online giving "Vanco" and set up a regular payment with your credit card or with your bank account.
4. You may set up an automatic RMD (Required Minimum Distribution) or other automatic payment from your retirement account.
