Here is the current update from the last session meeting:

- Live streaming and in-person Worship services continue.
- Communion observed in the sanctuary on March 28th and April 7th.
- Read thank you letters from Presbytery on recent giving.
- Presbytery meeting on April 19th and 20th to be held in-person.
- Rev. Danny Peters will be the guest preacher on April 28th (possibly on Mother's Day).
- Pastoral Transition:
 - Candidate preached at a neutral church in the area. Search team decided to not call the candidate.
- The Lectio-Divina study going well. Full group present last Sunday.
- Sabbath video viewings moved to April 21st and 28th.
- Discussing possibility of outdoor summer worship services.
- Donald is healthy and will be reinstated as a custodial helper.
- Roofing consultant returned their report. Recommend the consultant to generate
 a construction spec and obtain more bids. HPC to start a building campaign.
 Project cost for roofing and 2 HVAC replacements estimated at \$300,000.
 \$200,000 already donated. Kick off potluck to be held May 5th.
- Outstanding Synod loan is a little over \$17,000. A request has been made by Presbytery to pay off the loan. Quarterly payments will be increased to pay off the loan by the end of the year.
- Stay safe and healthy.
