The trees in our neighborhood have just started to show the early signs of Fall, with the leaves beginning their transition from green to hints of yellow. For some reason I felt completely surprised by this sight. Never mind that it was 80 degrees when I noticed the change as I drove back home from work at HPC. It still felt like summer outside, but the trees know that a change of season is coming.

There's an old saying that the one constant in the world is change. It's true in the seasons, it's true in life, and it's true in the church. Somehow even when we know change is coming, seeing the first signs of that change can still take us by surprise and can take a while to adjust. Regarding the recent monarchy transition in the UK, people keep remarking how strange it is to see King Charles III now in that role, after so many years of his mother on the throne. Along with wondering of how long he will be king (given his age of 73) before his son William takes the throne.

I'm sure some of you may understand that same feeling with your pastoral transition. It's always strange the first few Sundays when the new Interim Pastor gets up in service. Different style, different voice, different height! Wonderings about how long this interim pastor will be with us before our new permanent pastor is called. These questions are all normal, and part of the early process at the beginning of any pastoral transition. There can also be anxiety when it comes to pastoral transitions. Will the interim pastor really have our best interest in mind?

While some of our questions will be reliant upon God's will and timing, I can share these assurances: After 14 years as an interim pastor in our Presbytery, I have witnessed God do wonderful things for the churches in transition that I've served. Together we will watch for God's fingerprints on HPC and our community, so together we can get a sense of where God is leading HPC in the future. And second, everything I do as your interim pastor will be with all of the love, wisdom, and care I can offer. Every sermon, every meeting, every conversation will be with my eyes focused on seeing what the future may hold for HPC.

Back to our original image. When the leaves begin to change colors, the trees are already at work preparing for next Spring. As we enter this season of transition, let us as a church family prepare our hearts in prayer and hope for what God is planning for our future.

There are several ways you can donate online:

You can set up a profile so it is easier each time you log in to give, or you can donate as a guest user each time. Donations can be from a checking/savings account, or a bank card.

4. You may set up an automatic RMD (Required Minimum Distribution) or other automatic payment from your retirement account.
