

# **PASTOR MESSAGE**

Rev. Rachel Guevara

I recently visited a parishioner in one of the local facilities, and as I arrived, I realized there were Covid warnings all over the front doors. Upon entry, the staff had all donned N-95 masks, and various warnings were posted on doors for those patients who were sick with this virus we are now all-too familiar with. I was struck immediately by memories of the pandemic. I served as a hospital chaplain early in the pandemic, after my church had closed for what would be one year. Later – still identified as "the pandemic" – I served hospice patients. I have many memories of staff's fears, of patients who died, and of course of the personal and family impact this all was, including upon churches like this one.

This is grief, isn't it? We so often think of "grief" as just sadness when someone we love passes away. But it sure is more complicated than that. I know my own body, mind, and spirit hold tremendous grief from the pandemic that I will carry for a long time and still find difficult to talk about. As I walked through this facility, I remembered one of the important tasks of the grief process is to integrate that loss with what our lives are now. We never go back to how things once were – before we lost our loved one, for example. While their death becomes a landmark or a "before and after" for us, this loss will forever be part of our lives, and our lives will be different. There are a number of ways to remember our loved one or to breathe in what is new (which God promises), while still holding on to what was lost.

Grief is an epidemic. These days, we are all grieving, all the time. In my sermon series this month, we will consider the issue of grief and hopefully find ourselves "Beyond the Valley." There are some other special events coming up I want to highlight:

- We are launching a grief support group in early October. Please read the accompanying article to find out more! This is a tremendous opportunity for us to receive support whatever your loss is and to invite someone (the community is welcome) who needs that support. I guarantee you know someone who is grieving.
- September 7th in worship we have a special announcement, as we welcome a "Ministry Intern" to HPC, who has a great desire to grow in our ministry to babies and children. We will also pray for our children as they begin school.
- I will be taking Study Leave September 9th to the 13th. I am available for emergencies but look forward to a time of study and devotion.
- September 14th is New Members and Baptism Sunday! It is also Birthday Sunday!

### Finding Healing Together "Agape" Grief Group: A New Grief Support Group at Hillsboro Presbyterian Church



"Life is full of questions and pain."

These words echo the heart of what many of us experience in times of loss. In moments of grief, we ask hard questions—Where is God? Why am I suffering? How do I find peace? These questions don't often need answers as much as they need a listening heart.

Hillsboro Presbyterian Church is excited to explore a new opportunity in partnership with Agape Hospice: the start of an **in-person grief support group** right here in our church, open to the community and of course all those who attend HPC. The goal of this group is to provide a safe, welcoming space for anyone navigating loss of a loved one, spouse, friend — whether recent or long past. Together, we will seek healing, not through easy answers, but through presence, compassion, and community.

We hope you'll consider joining us—or inviting someone who might benefit—as we walk this sacred path together.

This group begins in October, and we will meet the First and Third Thursdays of the month. Join us in the Green Room from 1:30 to 3:00 pm, for fellowship, light refreshments, and mutual support. We begin on October 2nd.

# SACRED STEWARDS

We have reached the time of year when Session starts to prepare the budget for the next year. There will be more information coming with the start of the annual Stewardship campaign. Please be in prayer to learn how God would have you give for 2026.

As a reminder, we have some people in our congregation who contribute to the church using their Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) from their IRA.

At age 73, the IRS requires a person to take a certain amount of money out of their IRA. There's a formula for figuring out how much money a person would actually need to take each year.

The money that is removed from the IRA is taxed as ordinary income on an individual's tax return. One way to not be taxed on this money is to have it sent directly to a charitable organization, like HPC. This is called a qualified charitable distribution (QCD). If you want further information about QCDs, how they work, and how they may benefit both you and the church, I recommend you speak to your tax preparer or your financial advisor.

Disclaimer: This topic is to give basic information only. I am not an expert, and I am not trying to advise anyone on what they should or shouldn't do regarding their finances. This is where we are financially as of the end of July. Income includes pledges, offerings,







building use income, interest income, and designated income.

# **HPC ONLINE GIVING**

Online giving is available and ready to use for your convenience!

- There are several ways you can donate online:1. Download the free "Vanco Mobile" app on your iPhone or Android
  - 2. Scan the QR code to the right.
  - 3. Go to our website; www.hillsboropres.org and click on the "donate now" button.

You can set up a profile so it is easier each time you log in to give, or you can donate as a guest user each time. Donations can be from a checking/savings account, or a bank card.


We hope the option of donating online helps many of us who don't carry checks or cash every day, but still want to financially support HPC.

- 1. We don't "pass the plate" any longer, but we have a box inside the doors as you enter the sanctuary and you may place your donation there on Sunday.
- 2. You may set up a regular "bill-pay" through your bank that will automatically send a check to the church.

3. You can use our online giving "Vanco" and set up a regular payment with your credit card or with your bank account.

4. You may set up an automatic RMD (Required Minimum Distribution) or other automatic payment from your retirement account.
